This Friday, April 13, the **Common Ground Coffeehouse** at the Harbor Church will screen *Last Men in Aleppo*, “a tightly focused, on-the-ground account” (*Los Angeles Times*) of three of the founders of the White Helmets, ordinary citizens who risk their lives constantly as first responders to explosions in the ongoing Syrian civil war. The film won the Grand Jury Documentary prize at the Sundance Film Festival and was nominated for Best Documentary Feature at the 2018 Academy Awards.

Next week, April 20: *The Post*, another 2018 Best Picture nominee.

Next Monday, April 16 at 6:30 p.m., the **Samaritans of Rhode Island** will host a presentation featuring Anita Baglaneas Devlin, author of "S.O.B.E.R." a memoir she wrote with her son Michael about his struggle with addiction to opiates and thoughts of suicide. Copies of the book will be available for purchase and signing following the lecture and audience questions and answers.

April is National Poetry Month. On Friday, April 27, 7:15 p.m., the sanctuary will resound with “**Voices from the Village,**” a celebration of poets and poetry, Reciters and readers from the Block Island community (many not usually associated with poetry) will present their favorite poems.
