

From the Pastor: Beginning with Middle Schoolers ...

If we are going to build a youth ministry at Harbor Church, our best opportunity is to focus on involving middle school students. Already we are taking four "baby steps" in this effort:

- 1. Becca Hollaway is leading a Youth Sunday School at 9:00 a.m. aimed at grades 6-8. These students are old enough to attend the full worship service at 10:00 a.m.
- 2. The Ecumenical Youth Group will begin having regular meetings on Sunday evenings at 7:00 in the Rec Center for fun activities and a brief time of spiritual focus.
- 3. We are working on plans for a **Youth Mission Trip** soon after school is out in June. Rather than waiting for a youth group to develop fully, we want to use the mission trip as a means of recruiting youth and building solidarity as a group. I have been researching agencies that offer pre-packaged mission trips with meals, evening programs, and fellowship with other youth. The Roosa Fund has expressed willingness to cover much of the cost of this trip with a grant, although we will expect the youth to also do some fundraising. I hope to announce details soon.
- 4. The church is sponsoring **Boy Scout Troop 30** which reaches out to boys in grades 5-8 and meets Fridays at 2:30 in the Rec Center. Bernadette McNerney is serving as troop leader, assisted by several parents. They recently had a couple of archery activities and are beginning to work on merit badges.

Our youth ministry will be strengthened this summer by the arrival of Kadin Williams, our third intern from Princeton Theological Seminary. He comes from Costa Mesa, California, and will be visiting Block Island in April. The church will be operating the Summer Rec Center again with hours for grades 4-5, 6-8, and 9-12. We have received grants from both Princeton and from BIRA to cover most of the cost of having an intern. Thank you!

The Christian Education Committee has general oversight of the Youth Ministry. If you have any love in your heart for middle schoolers and are willing to assist with activities, please contact Christian Education Co-chairs Barbara Temple and Rheba McKernan, or Becca or me. We're going to have some fun—and lives will be shaped by this ministry.

HELP US RELIGHT THE CHURCH

We are embarking on a campaign to replace all our chandelier and wall sconce bulbs with LED's which we anticipate will reduce our electric usage for lighting by 86%. These new bulbs are instant-on and dimmable, and they contain no mercury so will not require special disposal like CLF's (although they tell us they last 22.8 years!).

We plan to replace a total of eighty bulbs for a total expense of \$1,000. The Trustees are hoping you will join our effort by sharing the initial expense with the purchase of two bulbs for \$25.

The difference is marked – we have "test bulbs" in one fixture in the sanctuary (an added extra, the old chandelier sparkles with new life!) and another in Fellowship Hall. This brand is NOT "curly" so we are not losing the traditional feel of our lighting. Please join our effort! And our thanks and gratitude to Martha Ball who has left Stewardship to take on several new challenges, noted above, and Cindy Pappas, who has been a gentle and caring leader for Christian Education and is now moving on to the Stewardship Committee.

A BALANCED BUDGET FOR 2012!

After much cutting – and salary freezes – the Executive Board, with the able assistance of Treasurer Cheryl Blane and Stewardship Chair Bill Penn, developed a budget with an \$851 shortfall vs. the substantial operating deficit incurred in 2011. When that news circulated among the congregation, a church member added \$851 to an already generous pledge, and we had a balanced budget! Now, the task before us is keeping expenses in line AND being sure our income meets, and hopefully exceeds, expectations. Thanks to everyone who responded to last fall's pledge campaign—An Attitude of Gratitude. The deadline was last November, but if for any reason you missed it, new and/or renewed pledges are always joyfully accepted. We also have some new fundraisers in the works, which will provide wonderful opportunities.

How are we doing? The following shows actual income year-to-date vs. projections of monthly income needed to achieve our budget goals for 2012:

Clayhead Pottery

Imagine a fun place where kids and adults can get together and paint mugs and other treasured keepsakes. This was the vision Becca and Rheba had back in the fall of 2010 when they started Clayhead Pottery. In return for using the church's facilities, ten percent (10%) of all sales and the additional cost for electricity to run the kiln was pledged back to the church.

During 2011, the studio was run on a part-time basis, opening once or twice a month during the off-season. In July and August, it opened three hours/day on Mondays and Wednesdays. Total sales for the year were \$2,142; from this, \$680 was given to the church. The balance of the income paid for greenware, supplies, and a part-time helper in the summer.

No special talent is needed to create a one-of-a-kind piece of art, nor is it just for kids. Children as young as 3 and adults well into their senior years came to paint pottery. And everyone of all ages is looking for something fun to do on a rainy day. On a rainy afternoon in August, 65 people suddenly showed up. In just those few hours, sales for the year were doubled. While no one is wishing for a lot of rainy days this summer, Clayhead Pottery plans to take advantage of any rainy-day opportunities that come its way.
